MISSION

ECHOS serves families in need by providing access to health and social service resources that can improve their lives.

The organization primarily serves the underserved, vulnerable working poor, unemployed, and people affected by disasters.

ECHOS serves families from 121 zip codes and five counties across the Houston area.

Our clients' average monthly household income is \$1,239.

Our families make difficult choices and encounter barriers such as job loss, housing stability issues, rising food prices, and limited access to medical care.

In 2022, 38% of those served were children under the age of 18.

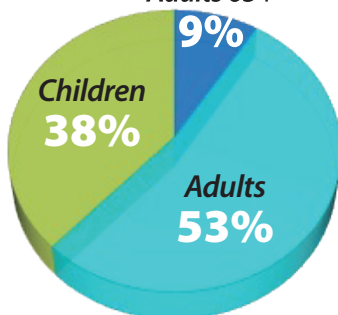

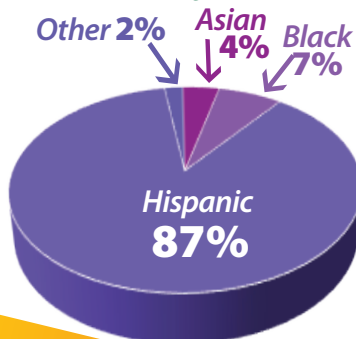
Number of Service Units Provided In 2022

Housing Stability Programs

Eviction Prevention Programs: rent and utility assistance.



Case Management

One-on-one case management sessions working with clients to develop budgets, set goals, develop long-term financial stability and employment plans.



Benefits Application Assistance

Help with SNAP, Medicaid and Harris Health applications for eligible families.



Food Pantry Services

Weekly drive-through distributions of fresh and non-perishable foods.



Healthcare Services

Children and adult immunizations and other healthcare services.



Medical Resident Training Program

Residents from Texas Children's Hospital come to ECHOS to learn about the barriers impoverished families face accessing primary healthcare.

2022 Results

1,739 individuals remained safely housed.

93% remained safely housed 90 days after exiting program
53% served in the program were children

42,170 individuals (duplicated) served by the ECHOS Food Security Program.

434,720 meals distributed, valued at \$1,282,425
35% of those fed were children under age 18
562 individuals received diapers

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
